On April 9, 2019, the Charleston Women in International Trade (CWIT) hosted the Charleston Soirée to celebrate the Woman of the Year and Scholarship Recipients. The Woman of the Year is a prestigious award that recognizes a woman involved in the field of international trade who has made an outstanding contribution to her profession, and in so doing, enhanced the status of women in international trade. The award recipient's character, integrity, knowledge and dedication to her profession make her a role model in the field of international trade. This year, CWIT recognizes Betsy Burton as the Woman of the Year. Betsy is the President and CEO of Holy City Solutions. She also serves as the VP of Quality Control at Premier Logistics. Additionally, Betsy has also served in several volunteer organizations heading various committees and is currently a member of Charleston Women in International Trade and Women in Defense and OWIT.

In 2004, CWIT began offering scholarships to aid South Carolina resident students who are enrolled/enrolling in an accredited higher education program in pursuit of a degree specific to international trade or related course of study. To date, CWIT has given away \$100,000 in scholarships. This year, CWIT awarded scholarships to the following winners: James (Jimmy) Harden was selected as the \$1,000 Technical Scholarship Winner; Austin Setser won the \$500 High School Scholarship; Alicia Cruz was awarded the \$1,000 High School Scholarship; Paige Robinson won the \$4,000 College 1st Place Scholarship; Renee Faley was awarded the \$2,000 College 2nd Place Scholarship and Jonathan Dickey won the \$1,500 College 3rd Place Scholarship.

"Creating More Opportunities for Women in Trade is the Right Thing to Do" by Mucha Mlingo



Gender inequality is more than a moral or social issue, it is a critical economic challenge. Women account for half the world's working-age population and if they do not achieve their full economic potential, the global economy will suffer.

A McKinsey Global Institute report finds that \$12 trillion could be added to



global GDP by 2025 by advancing women's equality (McKinsey Global Institute, 2015).

Economic evidence shows that giving women the same opportunities as men improves a country's competitiveness and productivity, which in turn has a positive impact on economic growth and poverty reduction.

Globally, the elimination of all forms of discrimination against women could raise per capita productivity by 40 per cent, according to the World Bank (Doing Business Report, 2017).

Women play a significant role in the global economy. They invest more in their communities – more than men typically do. Their participation in the economy would also stimulate wider benefits. Studies of economies as varied as Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, Ethiopia, and the United Kingdom, suggest that women generally devote more of the household budget to education, health, and nutrition than men.

From the Tampa Bay Times:
"Global Trade and Tampa Bay"

In the 2016 presidential election campaign, global trade deals were harshly criticized,

particularly those involving China. The admission of China into the World Trade Organization in 2001 did result in the closing of thousands of U.S. factories, and too many factory workers lost good-paying jobs. American consumers as a whole benefited because they could purchase less expensive "Made in China" consumer goods. Global corporations importing and selling these goods made greater profits since Chinese wages are so low as compared to U.S. wages. In the past two years, concerns about China's theft of



American companies' intellectual property, on-going cyber-security attacks against the U.S. from some foreign countries and a perceived rise in illegal immigration have increased support for protectionist trade policies - and not just in communities that lost manufacturing jobs.

Of course, "Made in the USA" products are popular because we all want to support American jobs. But international trade is not just about merchandise and commodities. It includes technology transfers, software, recreational and medical tourism, sporting events, foreign students and cross-border services like legal, accounting and project management.

American consumers are more exposed to foreign imports than they are to our nation's exports. Numerous government and private sector studies reveal that exporting companies pay higher wages than domestic companies in almost every industry sector.

Many residents of our Tampa Bay region may not realize how much international trade adds to our quality of life here - imported foods adding to our food security, world-class medical centers and universities attracting foreign patients and students, high-paying jobs and new technologies created by our exporters as well as foreign firms setting up operations here, a rapid expansion of Port Tampa Bay and an increase in the international flights to and from Tampa International Airport.




